

COLLECTIVE WORSHIP POLICY

The Governors and school recognise the requirements set out in the 1998 Reform Act, regarding Collective Worship in schools.

Assemblies which incorporate an Act of Worship (ACW) will take place every day. The time at which this takes place and the form of the ACW (whole year group, year houses or class groups) will vary from day to day.

The majority of the Assemblies (ACW's) will be wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian nature. Many of the moral issues conveyed to the pupils will reflect the values and behaviours, which the groups of Christian churches would wish to instil in a Christian community.

Every child will take part in Assembly (ACW) unless withdrawn by his/her parents/carers. Whilst making every effort to comply with the law, the governors and school recognise that, and will be sensitive to the fact that many of our pupils (and staff) will not come from a religious background.

The headteacher will keep a record of all Assemblies (ACW). Heads of Year will also keep a record of assembly themes.

The school will endeavour to ensure that it complies fully with the law but recognises that physical, practical (e.g. examinations) and resource constraints may make this impossible on occasions.

ASSEMBLIES

Year tutors will be present in both Year assemblies and Main Hall Assembly. Registration should take place in the main hall before assembly begins. A record of assembly themes is kept by Heads of Year and, in the case of Year Group assemblies, by Mrs B Bates.

Year group assemblies are as follows:

Monday	Year 7 Main Hall assembly
Tuesday	Year 9 Main Hall assembly
Wednesday	Year 11 Main Hall assembly
Thursday	Year 8 Main Hall assembly
Friday	Year 10 Main Hall assembly

In addition, each tutor group will have a Year Group assembly in their own block, once a week.
